

MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT: TRUE PEACE

I vividly remember the first time I sat in the driver's seat and handed over the keys to my oldest son. He was learning to drive and he needed to get the hours necessary to complete driver's training. Even as I am writing this, I feel like I am starting to sweat. I remember pulling out of the driveway as we started for our drive. I think I might have even been trembling. I remember reaching for the wheel once out of instinct as we were driving down the road and pressing my foot on the floor every time we would come to a stop. It had nothing to do with his driving skills. He was a good driver. It had everything to do with control.

I believe to some extent we all like some sort of control. It gives a type of security blanket. It gives us the sense that we can get what we want and when we want it. It gives you a temporary sense of peace. But, what happens when the things we control don't work out the way you planned them? Could there be a correlation

between giving total control to God and finding true peace?

Perfect peace comes from abandoning your life to God, trusting Him with your past, present and future. Proverbs 16:3 says, "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." Proverbs 3:5-6 says, Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight. If we want to find perfect peace, we will need to let go of the need to be in control and recognize His ultimate authority. In a recent chapel, we talked about how giving God total control of your life would bring peace in our lives. We talked about surrendering control to God our future - our dreams, our goals, aspirations, career, our calling, and even who we are going to marry. We talked about how difficult it is to surrender to God control of our money, possessions, and even our time.

Scripture records in Matthew 19:16-22 the story of the

rich young ruler. It talks about how he comes to Jesus saying what "things" do I need to do to inherit eternal life. Ultimately the conversation leads to the one thing the rich young ruler could not relinquish control of and that is his possessions. The Bible says he went away sad and probably never found the peace in life in which he was seeking. The scripture also records another person in Luke 1:26-38 named Mary. Gabriel comes to her to tell her that she will be the mother of Jesus, the son of God. Obviously Mary asked Gabriel some legitimate, logical and logistical questions. But in the end her response was "May your word to me be fulfilled" (Luke 1:39).

I can't think of a better Christmas gift to get yourself this year than to find that peace that only God can provide. That peace can only come when we totally surrender control to God. How would your life change? How would your family be changed? What if we as a NMCS Comet community surrender control to God? No doubt it would change our school and community. It sheds a new light on when Jesus is called the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).


BUILDING THE FUTURE AUCTION

Bennett claimed "All Region" honors. Tossey also was voted to the All State honorable mention team.


The varsity boys soccer team put forth an impressive effort finishing with a record of 15-5. NMCS also won their Comet Cup invite at the start of the season.
